TRAINING CONFERENCES

Officer Training Conference (OTC)

Officer Training Conference is an annual event for new Club Officers to gain necessary leadership skills and training for the term that typically takes place **between May and July**. At OTC, various workshops are provided to cover all necessary skills to be a successful leader. All Club Officers are strongly encouraged to attend in order to fully understand their position, grow as a leader, and learn more about their role in Key Club International. Of course, members are ALWAYS welcome to take advantage of the opportunities at OTC as well!

Region Training Conference (RTC)



A Region Training Conference is put on every year by the current Lt. Governor(s) in your Region or combined Regions, usually in the first few months of the school year (September-November). At the Region Training Conference, you will meet Key Club members from other clubs in your Region. There will be informative workshops on various topics that will help you and the other members of your club. There will be Icebreakers so you can get to know members of the other clubs in the Region. You will leave this conference knowing so much more about Key Club and how to be a more effective officer, leader, and member.

Candidate Training Conference (CTC)

Candidate Training Conference is an annual event for Key Clubbers learn from current LTGs on what it takes to be an LTG and gain new skills to help prepare for Conclave. It typically takes place **between November and January**. This conference is great for anyone who wants to become LTG or is unsure if they want to run.

CNH District Convention (DCON)

Meet Key Clubbers across the District from California, Nevada, and Hawai'i. Attend workshops, meet new friends, gain new leadership skills, and more to grow as a student and leader. Celebrate all you have accomplished this term by receiving awards, scholarships, competing in spirit battles, and seeing your district board retire and new officers installed. By listening to amazing keynote speakers and attending awards ceremonies, there are tons of lifelong memories and bonds to be made at District Convention. DCON typically happens from the end of March to the end of April.

Key Club members can attend the Key Club International Convention to get ideas for service and learn to become better leaders. Meet and make new friends from around the globe or virtually to learn how to increase your impact in your school and community during the **Summer**. At ICON, you also have the chance to elect the new International board!

PTP → Pediatric Trauma Program

The Pediatric Trauma Program (PTP) is one of CNH District's preferred charities, meaning it focuses on fundraising for this particular initiative. With the money that Key Clubbers fundraise for PTP, the money is allocated to producing resources and educating community members about the prevention of unintentional injury and death amongst children. PTP of CNH partners with 6 hospitals in supporting their pediatric units and programs.

The CNH District has a goal of raising \$225,000 for PTP this term!


The money that Divisions raise for PTP can be used at Fall Rally North/South to "bid" for District Officers that are on stage.

HOSTING SUMMER EVENTS

Although schools are typically on "break," Key Club stays active during the summer months! To maintain strong member retention before club rush, it's especially important for clubs host meetings and events between June and August. Many local service groups (including your sponsoring Kiwanis) will organize service events or fundraisers that you can partake in. Keep in mind that despite our return to safe in-person gatherings, it may even be advantageous to integrate virtual events as well! This ease in accessibility will allow members to stay engaged and participate, even if they're away on vacation.

TIPS + TRICKS: INCREASING ATTENDANCE DURING SUMMER

1. Cater to YOUR MEMBERS:

- a. Get a sense of what type of events your members are looking for during the summer (service, fundraising, social, etc)! Their interest directly impacts their attendance, and oftentimes, you can combine these categories. If an event becomes repetitive, don't be afraid to try something new!
- EX: Host a poll on your division Instagram for which upcoming events members will attend.

2. ADVERTISE:

- a. Whether it be via social media or word of mouth, it is important for members to be AWARE of what events are taking place and when.
- Advertise through multiple avenues to remind members that an event is taking place.

Consider the SETTING:

a. As we introduce more and more in-person events, please be wary of the weather! You want your members to feel comfortable during an event, so be sure to check the forecast/location prior!

If you are still not satisfied with turnouts, please rest assured that your efforts are not in vain! Ultimately, less member engagement during summer is very common and oftentimes, out of your control. Nevertheless, do not be discouraged as you've been able to hone your organization and planning skills in preparation for club rush!

TIPS + TRICKS: ATTRACTING PEOPLE DURING CLUB RUSH

- Show off Spirit Gear/Cheers
- Offer Incentives (candy, stickers)
- 3. Make a photo booth
- Provide Future Meeting Dates/Contact Information
 - a. EX: Pass out business cards to stop long lines
- Promote Key Club Ideals (LICC, Service)

- Show and Explain Key Club highlights (Fall Rally, DCON)
- 2. Show off your mascot
 - a. EX: Division Mascot Fursuit
- 3. Invest in a megaphone
- Keep your booths engaging by incorporating games
- Advertise how Key Club can help THEM (fulfill service requirement, find a community, etc)



The MR or Member Recognition (aka Mango Rice) Committee, is composed of the MR Chair, MR Mentor, and 10 Lieutenant Governors. Our responsibilities include: recognize service, fundraising, and leadership efforts by members, officers, advisors, clubs, and divisions; promote any and all district and international recognition programs; ensure that each contest rubric measures intended behaviors and actions; educate members on the technicalities of Annual Achievement Report (AAR) scores and the Member Recognition Program (MRP); and update the Cyberkey with new recognition materials such as contest guidelines and certificate templates. 




