MEMBER

- **Continue to stay involved in various aspects of Key Club** (club, division, district, etc.)
- **Ask your LTG for possible events opportunities to fulfil rubric requirements**
- **Take photos of yourself at every event you attend** (service, social, DCM)

ADVISOR

- **Ask permission to take photos of your advisor at events** (most photos consist of members)
- **Keep screenshots of text messages or emails between your club and your advisor**
 - **Ask your LTG for contest deadlines**

CLUB

- **Aim to grow your club in multiple aspects** (membership, service hours, attendance, etc)
- **Host multiple club events throughout the term**
 - **Encourage members/officers to attend Kiwanis Family events**
 - **Always ask for a club photo at events**
